CALL TO ORDER

Presiding Councilmember Dunn called the public hearing to order at 10:30 a.m.

Councilmember Dunn opened the hearing and the clerk read the ordinance title into the record.

Nicole Gorle, Senior Legislative Analyst, provided an overview of the proposed interlocal agreement for \$437,500 in Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery grant funds. The term of the agreement is through December 31, 2023.
