CALL TO ORDER

Committee Chair Mead called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m. and provided instructions for those wishing to provide public comment for both in-person and remote via Zoom.

PUBLIC COMMENT

There were no persons present wishing to provide public comment.

ACTION ITEMS

1. Ordinance 22-075, related to the 2022 Budget; making an emergency appropriation in the Evergreen State Fairgrounds
Capital Improvements and Operating Reserve Fund 180 to authorize expenditure of prior year surplus revenues and admission tax revenues to support costs associated with the Fairgrounds

Nicole Gorle, Senior Legislative Analyst, provided a staff report and explained that the Department of Budget and Finance reviewed the revenue and expenditures for last year and there is a surplus of \$19,160.00 to be put into the reserve fund for capital improvements for the fairgrounds.

ACTION: Move to Regular Agenda, General Legislative Session January 11th to set time and date for public hearing.

2. Motion 22-555, approving an Interlocal Agreement between the city of Monroe and Snohomish County for disbursement of funds for sidewalk extension adjacent to the Evergreen State Fair Park

Nicole Gorle, Senior Legislative Analyst, provided a staff report and said the County has agreed to contribute a one-time lump sum of \$275,000.00 on or before February 28, 2023, as contribution toward a project extending the sidewalk adjacent to the Evergreen State Fair Park. She also said the Prosecuting Attorney has approved the agreement as to form and a copy of the e-mail has been added to the record.

ACTION: Move to Consent Agenda, General Legislative Session January 18th for consideration.

3. Motion 22-556, approval of Amendment No. 4 to the Agreement for Services with Charles H. Montange for consultation and representation regarding Centennial Trail legal rights

Nicole Gorle, Senior Legislative Analyst, provided a staff report and explained the motion would approve Amendment No. 4 to the agreement by extending it one year to December 31, 2023, and adding another \$50,000.00 to the contract.

4. Motion 23-002, approving 2022 contract Amendment B with Washington Department of Commerce for the Bonneville Power Administration Low-Income Energy Efficiency Program
