3. Broadband Expansion Project - Ken Klein, Executive Director and Josh Dugan, Chief of Staff

Ken Klein, Executive Director, and Josh Dugan, Executive Chief of Staff, provided information and indicated plans to do an RFQ process to conduct a study to help identify broadband gaps in urban and rural areas, as well as explore opportunities to improve broadband connection and expansion.
