Jim Martin, Sr. Legislative Analyst, provided a staff report.

Councilmember Nehring requested information prior to the hearing about the following two items:

- 1. Multi-pronged sheltering expansion effort and funding for treatment/behavioral health. He said he would like to see a plan from Human Services on how those dollars will be spent and would like to see accountability built in.
- 2. Childcare for job seekers. He noted that the plan specifically calls out expending childcare for job seekers and he wants to make sure that people who are employed are not at a disadvantage. He asked to get clarification from Human Services and suggested making childcare available to anyone in need.

Councilmember Nehring said it would be helpful to get this information prior to the hearing. Mr. Martin said he would work with Human Services.
