Lacey Harper, Executive's Office, provided a brief introduction.

Josh Weiss, Gordon Thomas Honeywell, spoke about two budget request letters; Operating Budget letter including support for Afghan refugees and Capital Budget Priorities letter that includes funding regarding the Lynnwood Recovery Center and the Darrington Wood Innovation Center. He said he is requesting Council's support today.

Responding to Councilmember Low, Mr. Weiss described how the Senate and House versions of the first letter *[Operating Budget letter]* differ.

Councilmember Low said he was fine signing on to both letters. Councilmembers Nehring and Mead concurred.

Responding to Chair Dunn, Ms. Harper confirmed that the Executive will be signing both letters. Chair Dunn had no objections to signing the letters.

Mr. Weiss continued and spoke about the following items:

- Transportation revenue package discussion ensued and direction was given to Mr. Weiss.
