Ryan Countryman, Sr. Legislative Analyst, provided a detailed staff report. In summary, Mr. Countryman stated that the ordinance would authorize the Executive to execute the interlocal agreement with the Tulalip Tribes for the Phase II project. He said the fiscal implication for the total scope of work will be approximately \$773,000.00 and said, of this, the Ecology grant to Snohomish County will cover \$644,000.00 with the balance being provided by the Tulalip Tribes as a match. He said, if approved, the agreement would be in effect from the date of execution through July 30, 2025. Mr. Countryman said Risk Management and the Executive recommend approval.

ACTION: Vice-Chair Mead made a motion to set time and date for a public hearing for October 12, 2022, at the hour of 10:30 a.m. Councilmember Low seconded the motion and it carried unanimously by the four members present.

b. Motion 22-373, convening the Board of Equalization

Ryan Countryman, Sr. Legislative Analyst, provided a staff report and explained that this motion would approve the Board of Equalization's (BOE) request to convene for the purposes of hearing appeals for the 2022 assessment year. He said this is an annual event for the Council, there are no fiscal impacts, and the Executive recommends approval.

Mr. Countryman responded to questions from Councilmember Low regarding board vacancies. He also responded to Chair Dunn regarding the BOE matrix and said it can be found online.

ACTION: Vice-Chair Mead made a motion to approve Motion 22-373. Councilmember Nehring seconded the motion and it carried unanimously by the four members present.
