Jim Martin, Senior Legislative Analyst, explained the terms of the proposed lease amendment, which reduces the rent by \$71,428.57 per month for the period of June 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022.

J. Other Business

 Strengthening Public Health in Snohomish County - Lacey Harper, Executive Director, and Jason Biermann, Emergency Management Director

Lacey Harper, Executive Director, provided a comprehensive report on institutionalizing public health success by integrating Snohomish Health District and Snohomish County. She presented information on the benefits of

integration, governance and structure, potential risks, and the need to protect the independence of public health. Ms. Harper further explained the next steps to initiate an administrative process that would take approximately six months to complete and a County Health Department operating by January 1, 2023. She noted that a motion will be submitted to Council for consideration at the June 8, 2022 General Legislative Session to initiate the formal process of integration.

Jason Biermann, Emergency Management Director, and Ken Klein, Executive Director, were also available to respond to questions from Council.

The Council expressed support and appreciation for the comprehensive report and the focus on public health as they look forward to moving forward with integration.

In response to comments, Ms. Harper also acknowledged the importance of partnerships with cities and tribes on the effort in strengthening public health.
