Jim Martin, Senior Legislative Analyst, explained that the presentation by the Office of Recovery and Resilience on the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) 2023 Budget is a continuation from the Committee of the Whole Budget Deliberations Department Presentation on October 11, 2022.

Kara Main-Hester, Chief Recovery and Resilience Officer, provided a presentation on the 2023 ARPA Budget and highlighted the community-informed budgeting process, recovery road shows by Council District, pandemic recovery priorities and spending plan, and next steps for outreach and design.

Discussion ensued as Ms. Main-Hester responded to questions relating to revenue replacement, funding approval process, behavioral and mental health services, affordable and attainable housing, child care, and youth services.

Mr. Martin also provided additional information on the budget process and tools to transfer funds, as needed.
