**PURPOSE:** To authorize the County Executive, by Ordinance, to execute an Interlocal Agreement Between Snohomish County and the Tulalip Tribes of Washington for the Community Floodplain Solutions Phase II Project.

**BACKGROUND:** The County was awarded grant funds from the Washington State Department of Ecology to implement the Community Floodplain Solutions Phase II project. The Grant provides funding to advance the implementation of integrated floodplain management in the Snohomish Watershed, with focus on the lower Skykomish River, the Snohomish River mainstem, and Snohomish Estuary. Community Floodplain Solutions (CFS) aims to increase ecological function, reduce impact from flooding, and protect and enhance farmland productivity, through property acquisition, farmland conservation, implementation of agricultural viability and floodway projects, and design of large-scale integrated floodplain projects. The Grant identifies Tulalip Tribes as a project partner and requires the County and the Tribes to enter into an Interlocal Agreement with one another to complete the Riley and Haskel Slough Conveyance
