**BACKGROUND:** In January 2016, Island, San Juan, Skagit, Snohomish and Whatcom counties, entered into an Agreement to jointly provide a behavioral health program and regional system of care through a limited liability company, North Sound Behavioral Health Organization, with the collective goal of consolidating administration and reducing administrative layering, consistent with the State of Washington's legislative policy as set forth in RCW 71.24.015.
